Dumpster Day October 16 at Pool Parking Lot

Wiltondale residents can purge their properties of unwanted junk when the much anticipated Dumpster Day arrives on Saturday October 16.

The popular annual event, hosted free-of-charge by the county and coordinated by the Wiltondale Improvement Association, features four large dumpsters which are trucked to the pool parking lot. The containers will accept household refuse from 8:30 A.M. until they are full, which is usually well before noon.

The dumpsters will accept bulk trash such as large yard waste, appliances, woods, and metals. Not acceptable are liquids and hazardous materials such as paints, cleaning products, asbestos shingles, batteries, oil, and propane and other fuel tanks.

Residents are urged to arrive early since when the dumpsters are full, no further items can be accepted. Those arriving after the dumpsters are full will be turned away so that no excess junk remains in the pool parking lot after the dumpsters make their exit.


