Children's activities, including local sheriff's officers opening their police cars, demonstrating the capabilities of their trained canines and distributing information about emergency preparedness, will begin at 6 p.m. Towson emergency personnel will allow attendees to get close to a fire truck and ambulance and walk through a fire safety house.

A live local band will provide music for the crowd during the 6 p.m. dinner and ice cream social. Adults may participate in a 50-50 raffle following the 7 p.m. ceremony.

The Baltimore County police department and C.O.P. groups from 19 Towson neighborhoods cooperatively organized the event, which will be sponsored by Bradford Bank and Midstate Federal Savings and Loan Association and hosted by Uncle Wiggly's Ice Cream, First and Saint Stephen's United Church of Christ and the businesses of the 6700-6900 blocks of York Road.
