Dear Friends and Neighbors:

As this edition of the newsletter is going to press, Halloween is upon us and I want to compliment those of you who have taken obvious pains to decorate your homes in so many creative ways for the occasion. I have to confess that I probably enjoy this one evening of the year a little too much -- not for all the incessant reruns of horror movies on cable channels or the prospect of scaring trick-or-treaters with a ghoulish mask (although I've thought about it), but because it's such fun to walk the streets in the brisk fall weather, greet many friends, and see all the familiar neighborhood kids looking suddenly unfamiliar in their costumes. # 2008 Wiltondale Shade Tree Program

Many of you may recall that last year the Wiltondale Shade Tree Program qualified for a grant to purchase shade trees. Unfortunately, we were not able to qualify for the same program this year based on the intended location of trees to be planted in the front yard of residents rather than in the right-of-way between the road and sidewalks.

Not to be deterred and recognizing the importance of maintaining our tree canopy for generations to come, the Wiltondale Improvement Association (WIA) has appropriated \$3,000 to reimburse homeowners participating in this year's program up to \$150 per tree (maximum of two trees per household). Trees eligible for reimbursement should be planted within twelve (12') feet of the curb and away from any underground or overhead utilities. This year's program includes planting of the trees along with a one-year replacement warranty and tree gator to ensure that the trees are properly watered. The only condition is that participants must water trees at least twice each week during the warmer months.

We have enough funding to subsidize the planting of up to twenty (20) trees. It's first-come, first-served, so don't delay registering. From this point forward, the process will work as follows:

- Step 1: <u>Select Specimen</u> from the list below, <u>participants must advise us exactly what specimen they would like **NO LATER THAN 5 PM EST, FRIDAY, NOVEMBER 14, 2007**. If the nursery has limited supply, the orders will be confirmed on a first-come, first-served basis.</u>
- Step 2: <u>Submit Check</u> and specimen selection form to Tim Burkett (address below) before November 14. **These checks, representing the full payment for the installed tree, should be made payable to**"**Digging in the Dirt**". WIA will provide reimbursement checks to participants in the amount of \$150 per tree ordered during the week of delivery and installation.
- Step 3: <u>Select Location</u> where each tree is to be planted. The proposed site must be clearly marked until the tree is planted. Flags are available if anyone needs them. Contact us if you'd like help selecting an appropriate site for your tree.
- Step 4: <u>Planting</u> of the trees will occur after Thanksgiving, likely during the first week of December. Participants must have the site clearly marked where they'd like to have the tree planted. We'll notify each participant a few days in advance when an exact delivery date is known.
- Step 5: <u>Tree Care</u> for each tree, particularly through the first year while it's being established, is vitally important. Failing to do so could jeopardize your plant guarantee.

# Wiltondale Fall Family Party/Chili Cookoff Successful


