Wiltondale is both a traditional neighborhood and a neighborhood of traditions. As surely as spring follows winter, a busy calendar of community events unfolds in a continuum unbroken by the years and by happenings in the world at large. While the origins of some of our traditional events are lost in the mists of time, others are of more recent vintage and can trace their parentage to residents still in the neighborhood. The Easter Egg Hunt, the children's Halloween Party, and the Christmas Tree Lighting predate my family's two-decade tenure here, so I cannot comment on their birth. (although I'm sure there are longer-term residents who can). The Annual Party predates my time as well and has been through various formats and locations but has always been a capstone event attracting hundreds of residents of all ages who mingle, eat, drink and play in the mild late summer weather. Newer events include the Wiltondale/Overbrook Run for Greenwood Park, which was held several weeks ago and which raised \$4,600 for our park and playground, the recent Triangle Party/Happy Hour which welcomed new families to the neighborhood and introduced them to current residents, the Fall Family Party and Chili Cook-off held on the pool parking lot in October, and the always sold-out Super Bowl Weekend Bowling Bash at Stoneleigh Lanes.

While enjoyed by many, these events, from year to year, are often the work product of the few, most of whom serve or have served on the board of directors of the Wiltondale Improvement Association. Space will not permit me to list all of the residents who have devoted a great deal of their time and effort to either begin a tradition or maintain a tradition begun by others. I can, however, offer this year's lineup along with some kudos. Wiltondale Events Committee Chair **Lisa Stugart**, with help from committee members and others, will this year plan and execute many of the events, such as April's well-attended Easter Egg Hunt. **Kathleen Nuetzel**, who is also our Association's vice-president, this year organized the Run for Greenwood Park. This fundraising event was begun in 2000 by **Jennifer Carle** and a dedicated group of volunteers. **Joe and Lorri Schonfeld**, who started the Triangle Party in 1999, once again organized this popular event. **Barry and Muffie Rollins**, who in 2006 began the annual Super Bowl weekend bowling bash at Stoneleigh Lanes, are already looking forward to next year's gathering. And, the Fall Family Party and Chili Cook-off, which was begun in 2000 by **Megan Norris and Katie Kuhn**, will be held once again this Fall. All of these residents, as well as countless more unnamed, deserve our support and our thanks. Be sure to watch this newsletter for details of upcoming events. We hope to see you there.
