President's Letter

Summer brings a palpable vibrancy to Wiltondale. As the days lengthen and heat up, the number of residents outside seems to increase almost geometrically. From our house overlooking the triangle, we can see them all—the dog walkers, the runners, the bicyclists, and the children playing—all of them enjoying the weather and our beautiful neighborhood. What we can also see, however, is the number of cars and commercial vehicles that are driven at excessive speeds and without regard for the safety of pedestrians.

Speeding on our streets is not a new problem. I am in possession of the archives of the Wiltondale newsletter and have found that, over the years, speeding cars is the number one complaint of Wiltondale residents. (Barely besting the number two gripe: messy dogs). A great deal of time and energy has been spent by the Wiltondale Improvement Association in efforts to curb this problem. Through the years, all manner of official fixes have been tried—speed limit signs, portable digital speed displays, increased police patrols and, more recently, yard signs urging motorists to “Drive Like Your Children Live Here.” Some unofficial fixes have also been tried—the curbside little green men holding pennants, the strategically placed orange traffic cones, and—my favorite—the resident who, while washing his car, would hose down any speeding driver who passed his house.

The Board of Directors of our improvement association is studying this problem and is prepared to take drastic measures. One proposal is to identify chronic speeders and take action, including legal action, against them. While we know that many of the offenders are non-residents, some live here. So that summertime can be safely enjoyed by all, we urge everyone to drive slowly, even what seems to be painfully slowly, on our streets. Think of our neighborhood's streets as one long driveway to your house, a driveway that is full of children and toys, and drive accordingly. Save the speed for the highways and the interstates.
