Wiltondale Improvement Association President's Letter

I hope the 'back to school' season has gone well for everyone. And, how great is it that both the Ravens AND the Orioles are doing well at the same time? It's been a long time, and we certainly are enjoying it.

I would like to take this opportunity to update you on an issue that the Board has been working on for some time. As some of you are aware, for the better part of the past year, there has been a situation with a property on Stevenson Lane that created no small amount of anxiety among neighbors close by. The property in question is a rental, and was occupied by a tenant who appeared to be operating a business from the premises (i.e. selling firewood), among other things including violations of neighborhood covenants. Attempts to deal with these issues began as they should - with direct conversations between neighbors. When these were not productive, the County was engaged by both neighbors and the Board. In addition, the Board engaged the landlord, who had not registered the property as a rental with the County, directly. Over time, pressure on both landlord and tenant resulted in the tenant moving out at the end of August. In early September, a County hearing was held where the landlord was held responsible for multiple code violations and ordered to pay the expense of having a contractor clean up and renovate the back yard that had been dam-

aged by the business activities. We are told that the landlord intends to sell the property, though we continue to monitor the situation. As this unfortunate episode draws to a satisfactory conclusion for our community, we are reminded of two things. First, that disagreements between neighbors are best resolved that way - between neighbors. Second, when such a resolution is impossible, the Board is certainly willing to get involved to uphold the covenants, and to involve the County to ensure that laws are enforced. We are grateful for Baltimore County's support in this instance, and above all, for the patient persistence of the neighbors who were most directly impacted.

I was not able to attend due to a family wedding, but I trust that all who attended enjoyed the Annual Party at the pool. Special thanks go to Lisa Stugart, who coordinated the event. Thanks also to the team of volunteers who made it possible. As always, it takes a volunteer commitment to make our events successful, and we are grateful to Lisa and the team.

Finally, a friendly reminder to drive carefully on our streets. While our speed limits are posted at 25, my view is that is often too fast. Please drive to be safe. Thank you for your attention, and have a great month.
