## Wiltondale Tree Feeding Available

The Wiltondale Improvement Association, in partnership with  
Davey Tree Service, is offering a tree-feeding program for the  
third consecutive year. Participation in this program makes

# President's Letter

Dear Friends and Neighbors:

Last month witnessed the formal passing of winter as well as some noteworthy neighborhood events. First, many thanks to Kristen Rudolph and the Events Committee for organizing another enjoyable (if blustery) Easter Egg Hunt. We had many enthusiastic kids and parents turn out as well as a much-anticipated visit from the Easter Bunny (a/k/a Kathleen Nuetzel).

Wiltondale was represented by around fifteen residents at a meeting of the Baltimore County Planning Board on March 18. More than half of those representatives were permitted to speak in favor of a zoning resolution that would freeze the current housing density at the Donnybrook Apartments on Burke Avenue. (The current zoning would permit future redevelopment with much higher density.) Thanks to all who came out to express our collective concern over any further overcrowding of our schools and increased traffic congestion in Towson.

Public hearings like this provide a valuable forum to demonstrate the level of community concern that exists over these issues. I encourage those who could not make it this time to consider joining us at future proceedings as they are announced. Strength in numbers does make a difference at these meetings.

As we begin to venture forth and tackle those spring yard projects, I want to call your attention to the annual compost bin sale sponsored by Baltimore County. This year, the bins will be offered from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday, April 19, at the Carver Center for Arts & Technology at 938 York Road. These compost bins, valued at \$80, will be available at a subsidized price of \$35 each.

Finally, you should have recently received your 2008 WIA annual dues invoices. Although the Association operates very efficiently each year on a small budget, your individual payments are an essential element that allows it to function. Accordingly, your prompt payment of these dues would be much appreciated.
