WIA President's Letter

I have a few items to discuss as we get ready for summer and the pool. First, I'd like to thank all the runners and volunteers who turned out for the annual run to benefit Greenwood Park. Kathleen Nuetzel deserves special thanks for organizing this great event that raised approximately \$5,000 for the park fund.

By now you should have received your annual dues invoice. The modest \$40 annual dues covers an array of community costs and is a relative bargain compared to many other neighborhoods. Thank you in advance for your prompt payment.

If your sidewalks are crumbling or have some slabs that have pitched up and created a tripping hazard, Baltimore County has a program that makes replacement affordable. The county will replace the damaged sidewalks at a reasonable cost. The homeowner can pay for the replacement upon completion of the work or the county will add the cost to your tax bill spread over five years with no interest. In some cases, you may not have a choice. The county is inspecting some other neighborhoods nearby and making repairs to walks that do not meet the county code at the homeowner's expense as described above. Contact the Bureau of Engineering & Construction Highways Design, Room 200, 111 W. Chesapeake Ave., Towson, 410-887-3739, highways@baltimorecountymd.gov, and ask for an Application for Concrete Construction. Its website says there is a waiting period of up to one year before work can be completed under the program. If you have a pothole in your street that needs to be fixed, call the pothole line at 410-887-3560.

Finally, with the warmer weather many people sleep with their windows open at night. I've received several calls about dogs barking in backyards very early in the morning for long periods of time. Please let your pooch back in after the first couple of barks. Thanks for reading and see you at the pool.
