Baltimore County's Department of Public Works encourages citizens to use the three residential drop-off facilities that the county has available to regularly accept yard waste. These facilities, located at **10275 Beaver Dam, Cockeysville; 6259 Bays Cove Road, White Marsh; and 3310 Transway Road, Halethorpe** also accept other debris that will not be accepted at the neighborhood dumpsters. You may also bundle your debris and place is curbside for regularly scheduled yard waste recycling pickup.
