

In case you were not able to make the Public Hearing in Towson regarding BGE's response to the emergency, there is another scheduled for Tuesday, October 11 at 7:00 p.m. at Wohlman Assembly Hall, War Memorial Building, 101 N. Gay Street.

The weather couldn't dampen the spirits of the hundreds of residents who came out and enjoyed our neighborhood's Annual Party at the pool. Many thanks go out to Lisa Stugart and her many volunteers for another fantastic event. There was a DJ, food for all ages, swimming and glow sticks! Needless to say, a great time was had by all.

Keeping tabs on development that leads to encroachment and commercialization along the York Road corridor remains a high priority for the Board. Recently, the Zoning and Long Range Planning Committee joined efforts with Towson Manor Village to oppose new signage on the east side York across from Bateman's. The proposed sign was over four times the size of the existing and the request for a variance was withdrawn. Our thanks go to Chris Raborn for keeping an ever vigil eye on these issues and also to our friends in Towson Manor.

Issues like this one and many other things impact the quality of life in Wiltondale. The best way for you to ensure our neighborhood remains a desirable place to live and raise a family is to get involved. If you have ever wondered how you can make a difference, I'd like you to consider becoming a member of the Board.
